True Humility

The Parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector highlights the difference between pride and humility in prayer.

The Pharisee, confident in his own righteousness, he boasts to God about his good deeds, such as fasting and tithing. His prayer is self-congratulatory and contemptuous of others, including the tax collector. His outward religious actions are rooted in pride, so his prayer doesn't reach God.

The tax collector, despised by society, stands at a distance, beats his breast in sorrow, and humbly asks for God's mercy. His simple prayer comes from a repentant heart that recognises his need for forgiveness.

Jesus states that the humble tax collector, not the proud Pharisee, went home justified before God. The parable teaches that those who exalt themselves will be humbled, while those who humble themselves will be exalted. True righteousness is found in humility and genuine repentance, not in prideful observance of the law.

Let us pray that in our hearts we can eradicate the pharisaic attitudes in our hearts. But also we can ask true forgiveness with all heart and give credit, praise to God and others and cultivating our prayers with attitude of humility and repentance. **Amen**

WHITE POPPY

Has been worn in the run-up to REMEMBRANCE DAY for over ninety years as a symbol of REMEMBRANCE and PEACE. First produced in 1933 in the aftermath of the FIRST WORLD WAR by the Co-op Women's Guild to say 'NEVER AGAIN'.

White poppies stand for:- Remembrance of all victims of war, civilians and members of the armed forces, of all nationalities, wars past and present and refugees. Challenging war and militarism, as well as any attempt to glorify or celebrate war.
