Our Bodies and Churches are the Dwelling place of the Holy Spirit

We celebrate today the feast of the dedication of the basilica of St. John the Evangelist in Lateran, also known as the Holy Saviour or the Church of St. John the Baptist. It is the mother and mistress of all churches in Rome and the world — "omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput". The feast and the readings of the day remind us of God's presence in the church as a building and also within ourselves. We are the dwelling place of God, and therefore, we must keep ourselves holy and sacred.

In Ezekiel, the sign of God's presence is evident. In the temple, there is a river that flows — a symbol of life and joy flowing within us. It nourishes and satisfies us all and grants eternal joy! There is no longer hunger or thirst, and it also makes the place a sanctuary because we encounter Christ, who heals us and mends our wounds. Saint Paul adds that our bodies are the temples of the Holy Spirit. In fact, we can say that our hearts are the most "intimate sanctuaries of the Holy Spirit".

Let us pray, as Jesus exhorts us, to treasure the temple of the Holy Spirit, to revere our bodies and the church, to keep them pure, holy, and sacred, and to remove all unwanted objects that desecrate the dwelling place of God our hearts. Amen.

Why do pray for the dead? The answer is found in Scripture and Catholic Tradition, which form the foundation of the belief in purgatory. "We pray for them so as they can be purified and achieve holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Catechism clarifies that "this final purification of the elect ... is entirely different from the punishment of the damned" (CCC 1031). Heaven is the perfect union between God and man. Sin distances us from God, and to be in perfect communion with him, we must be completely free of sin. According to Scripture, one must be "clean" to enter heaven (Revelation 21:27). Therefore, a cleaning or "purification" is necessary for those who still require it. Just like a proper guest at a grand banquet, God desires us to be purified and properly attired to enter into the wedding feast of the Lamb".
