Novena, preparing to celebrate Our Lady Mary Immaculate

"Well, tomorrow begins the Novena of the Immaculate Conception. Our Lady always gives us feasts more beautiful than the last. I still remember the great celebration of 1854, when the dogma of the Immaculate Conception was proclaimed—how much joy it stirred among the people! I would like you to celebrate this novena in thanksgiving for the great grace we have received, and to ask her to preserve it. When you thank someone for a blessing, you encourage them to grant even more. Thank Our Lady, and she will rejoice.

From writing of St Joseph Allamano, 28 November 1915

What, then, should you do these days? I always tell you the same: avoid sin and avoid tantrums. These are not limited to children; adults commit them too —often inwardly—and if they are not shown outwardly, it is usually out of self-love.

Some days we are malicious, vengeful, or lacking in charity. I am a man who fears for us, and we must pray that Our Lady protect the grace she has obtained for us. I want there to be no deliberate venial sin in this house. During this novena we should be able to say: I am worthy of this house—that is, as St. Paul said, by the grace of God.

I propose nothing extraordinary: simply free yourselves from small sins and lessen your daily faults. Shake yourself and say: Come on, my soul, do not remain even a minute in lukewarmness. Be alive—not even a minute in discouragement or coldness."

The Patroness Feast of Mary Immaculate will be celebrated next Sunday 14 December. An important feast to our community, we will have only one Mass in the morning at 10.30am (please note there is no 8.30am Mass on the 14th). On the day we will inaugurate the jubilee of 175 years of our parish and the 100 years of Joseph Allamano in heaven, who died on the 16 February 1926. The jubilee year will start from December 2025 to December 2026.

Novena: Everyday after Mass, we have a novena. It will be available on our parish website. We are invited to pray also with our families. The novena begins on the 5th December to the 13th December culminating in a parish celebration on the 14th December.
