I Have Put My Spirit In Him

Christmas has been an effusion of fresh air, bringing peace, joy, and hope to the whole world, especially to the Christian faithful. We behold, face to face, Jesus, the Son of God, who made Himself visible to reveal to us the mystery of the Trinity. The “Invisible” God became visible in Christ Jesus, living as a citizen of this world among us.

This truth is an essential point of our Creed, illuminating our lives and giving us the certainty of God’s presence among us and of our successful future in Him. Not all recognised and welcomed Jesus as the Light of the World and the Messiah. He who created the world and came to His own home was not accepted, preferring darkness to light and death to life.

Jesus gave us an example of humility by desiring to be baptised by John the Baptist. He taught us to acknowledge the need to pass from slavery to freedom, from sin to holiness, from death to life.

John the Baptist was initially opposed to baptising Him, but Jesus pleaded with him to do it to fulfil all righteousness. Then the Holy Spirit and God the Father entered into action, introducing Jesus as the “beloved Son of God, in whom He is well pleased.” The Baptism was prefigured in the Old Testament by the crossing of the Red Sea by the Israelites fleeing from Pharaoh’s slavery into the land of freedom, where God sealed the Covenant with them. The real crossing of Christ was His baptism on the Cross. From the Cross, He led us to freedom. In every Baptism, this mystery is fulfilled thanks to Jesus’ personal example.

God the Father presented His own Son to us, glorified Him, and made Him the Leader, the new Moses, who will lead the world to Full New Life. God the Father instructed us to “LISTEN TO HIS SON,” to follow Him with all our heart, faith, and love. Though Jesus is “one dwelling with us,” one like us except in sin, He is the source of full life and grace. From that moment, Jesus becomes the only way of salvation; all of us need to welcome Him as the gift of His Father to us.
