Look, There Is The Lamb of God That Takes Away The Sins Of The World

John the Baptist declared Jesus to be a Saviour chosen by the Father to reconcile the whole world into one family, the Family of God. Besides the mission of bringing back the exiles and gathering the dispersed children of God, Jesus was chosen to be the light and salvation of the entire world: "All the earth will see the salvation of our God."

Jesus received the Holy Spirit to fulfil the task assigned to him by the Father. Led by the Spirit, he began his public proclamation at the synagogue in Nazareth when he had the opportunity to read Holy Scripture. There he read the prophecy of Isaiah, which described the mission he would undertake — a mission that began to be fulfilled as the passage was read.

Today we are also celebrating "Peace Sunday." Peace is Christ's gift to the whole world. In Scripture, peace is the fulfilment of God's plan, the full realisation of humanity's original aspirations, desires and perfection, and the well-being of all creation under his care.

Jesus blessed his disciples with a peace different from the peace we try to build on earth. "We are in a world torn by violence and war, a time of uncertainty" (*Bishop Arnold's letter*). Pope Leo's message, "Peace be with you all, toward an unarmed and disarming peace," is a challenging but inspiring goal. The Pope reminds the world that peace is not founded on fear, threats, or weapons but on open hearts that can create mutual understanding, hope and conflict resolution.

Peace is the gift we receive from Jesus and is meant to be extended to all communities, both small and large. Our families are the first centre of peace and love.

The Church, as God's family, must be an example, source and promoter of peace. The international community of nations is the forum where justice, peace, and fraternity should be genuinely promoted with sincerity, by sacrificing individualistic interests that undermine unity and common understanding.

Peace fulfils God's creation plan. Love is the essential nature of God — he is love itself: openness, compassion, justice, and transparency. Let us not betray or destroy the divine nature God gave us when he created us in the image of his Son.
