The People Who Lived In Darkness Has Seen A Great Light: Jesus Christ

Since God created us in the image of His Son, the world has been walking the path of darkness and light.

The light is a sign of joy, beauty, transparency, and security, an indicator of the best way to follow. Light is life; it is given freely to all who feel its need, to those who search for it. The light enlightens the way, facilitates smooth and swift walking and running, drives away doubts and fears, encourages encounters between people, and creates an atmosphere of joy.

Beyond these beautiful images, the light is God Himself. He is the light that gives life to the world, victory, and freedom from the slavery of sin and death. "The Word was the true light that gives light to everyone" (John 1:9). The response to Psalm 27 says, "The Lord is my light and my salvation."

The prophet Isaiah reports how the Lord comes to the aid of the humbled land of Zebulun and Naphtali: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light."

With such consoling words from the prophet Isaiah, Jesus recognised that God His Father gave Him the mission of proclaiming the Good News to all, beginning in Galilee. He chose and called the twelve apostles to help Him fulfil the prophecies. He gave them power, talents, and the joy of being companions in evangelisation. Jesus and His apostles rejoiced, seeing the wonders of giving light, hope, and joy to those searching for the Good News of God.

We, too, from Baptism were called to be prophets, priests, and kings and were given the Holy Spirit to fulfil our vocation and mission. With humble spirit but with confidence, courage, and joy, we are called to proclaim salvation to all in the name of Jesus. We will not be alone; the Spirit of Jesus and God the Father will be our wisdom, joy, and strength in such evangelising tasks. Amen.
