How Happy Are The Poor In Spirit, Theirs Is The Kingdom of Heaven,
Matthew 5

Jesus, at the beginning of His public life, needed to have consultations with His Father and the Holy Spirit. He spent hours in prayer and meditation on the full content of His role and mission, the methodology and the means to accomplish it, and the chances of success in fulfilling what the Father and the Spirit had planned with Him before He was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became also the Son of Man.

Led by the Father and the Holy Spirit, Jesus officially proclaimed that the Kingdom of God was at hand and that everyone had to repent and be open to it. At Nazareth, He declared that the prophecies about the Messiah were being fulfilled as He read them. In His first public appearance after His baptism, Jesus mentioned some important elements of the mission given to Him by the Father and the Spirit.

After that event in Nazareth, Jesus prayed to the Father to give Him light, a clearer vision of His mandate, and guidance on how to receive the much-needed help and support from the community. Guided by the Spirit, Jesus chose those who would and could accompany Him in introducing the Kingdom of God as the great goal to be achieved in everyone's life. He chose the twelve Apostles after spending a whole night in prayer and in dialogue with His Father through the Spirit.

Accompanied by the twelve Apostles, Jesus proclaimed the programme of the Kingdom—the requirements to enter it and be saved. This programme was more detailed and more challenging. The wonderful message called "The Beatitudes" was given by Jesus not as politicians and preachers do, proclaiming without practicing, but as a teacher who lives what He teaches. The Gospels reflect this truth when they describe the admiration of those who heard Christ preach with the authority of His example.

Briefly, the proposal of the Beatitudes is radical compared to today's thinking and way of living. Here are the virtues and behaviours required to be His disciples, to be blessed, and to be saved:

The essential virtues and attitudes are:

Humility before God and before our brothers and sisters, Gentleness, Readiness to comfort and console others, a deep hunger and thirst for what is right, Mercy and compassion, Purity of hearts, Peacemaking, Faithfulness to justice and to Christ in times of persecution.
