The Light That Glories God - Mt 5:13-16

Centenary Birthday of Saint Joseph Allamano in Heaven (1926-2026)

A hundred years ago, many mourned his death, yet his presence has never been lacking.

On February 15, 2026, we will celebrate the centenary of the birth into heaven of St. Joseph Allamano, founder of the Consolata Missionaries: priests and brothers (1901) and missionary sisters (1910).

We approach him with filial love, as the first missionaries did, to feel his presence, hear his words, and give thanks. As children of a saintly Father, we recommit to imitating his pursuit of holiness in service of the mission.

Allamano urged all missionaries to be holy, insisting that conversions depend on the holiness of those who preach: "Holiness must reside in the missionary; it must take root in his inner self and be evidenced in his conduct." This daily holiness is lived in small, ordinary acts - whether in early missionary years, in service, or in old age and illness - so that all life becomes a place of God's love. The centenary invites us to draw more deeply from the Founder's holiness and to live his charism, uniting holiness and mission in the spirit of consolation.

Witnesses to his final days confirm his reputation for sanctity: he celebrated his last Mass on February 1, 1926; received the Anointing of the Sick on February 15; blessed his children, prayed for God's will, whispered "Hail Mary," kissed the Crucifix, and died at 4:10 a.m. on February 16, 1926—his '*dies natalis*'.

Through him many missionaries went on "to be light of the world," bringing the Gospel and consolation to the ends of the earth. One hundred years on, we thank the Lord for the charism of consolation he inspired in St. Joseph Allamano. **Amen.**
